Congratulations to everyone who returned their cups on time for the 2016 Festival. This year Cups and Trophies are to be returned to the **convenor of the art** from which it was awarded by <u>the 23rd June</u> for the August Competitions and <u>the 11th August</u> for the September Competitions.

PLEASE NOTE: This year onwards, cups and trophy returns are to be arranged with the convenor of each art, drop off points will be listed in the syllabus. We would appreciate it if parents could ensure that cups are returned by these dates and we ask teachers to remind their students about returning any cups and/or trophies they received in 2016. Please treat these cups and trophies well and do not use abrasive cleaners when cleaning them prior to returning them, as they are very expensive to replace.

National Young Performer of the Year Awards

At PACANZ 2017 the Society will be represented by Shelton Shaw (Modern) & Dryw McArthur, Andrew Fleming, Henry McIntyre (Speech), Fuel Fitness (Troupes). Highland Nominees will be decided at our Competitions during this year.

After a lapse of 12 months, Vocal competitions were held in September 2016. A total of 23 entries were received for both Senior and Junior Sections. The numbers again were very low and it was disappointing for all those on our committee who worked hard to revamp our syllabus to try and get an interest in this art form so that it could be up and running once again. At this stage due, to the low numbers and lack of interest in the past, this art form may not proceed in 2017. **So a big call out to all teachers and pupils**, if you want to have vocal competitions, please tell us what you would like in the way of classes or how we can improve this art form to get it back to what it has been previously over the past years.

HIGHLAND & NATIONAL DANCING: Convenor - Heidi Boniface - 2158940

We had a pleasing number of entries this year which was up on last year and the day ran very smoothly. We had the benefit of a local judge this year and I appreciate the efforts by both the judge & our writer who was called in at the last minute. I would also like to thank our pipers Jorden Caig & Angus McIntyre for their hard work.

Thank you to the ILT and the St Andrews Scottish Society of Southland for their sponsorship of our event. The sponsorship by the Invercargill Licensing Trust meant that the senior dancers received cash prizes rather than ribbons for their events, which they appreciated and will hopefully mean more entries in this age group in the future. We again

struggled for younger dancers, under 7 and under 8 years which is unfortunately similar to other Highland Dancing competitions in this area.

I would like to thank all of the helpers on the day, Julia Adams who helped on the stage, Sharon Blackwood who helped on the door and Linda McLeod & Lyla Belesky who helped behind the scenes. I couldn't have run the day without you all. Next year's competition will be held at Repertory and the date will be Saturday 26th August 2017.

Another successful competition was held on 21st August 2016 at Repertory House, with competitors travelling from Christchurch to attend alongside the local dancers from Invercargill. We were fortunate to secure the services of Mary-Ellen McDonald to adjudicate, who did a marvellous job and provided some valued feedback to the competitors. To be able to host a competition in Invercargill means a lot to the local dancers, who generally have to travel far afield to obtain the stage and competition experience. This certainly would not be possible without the continued support and generous funding from our sponsors, mainly Invercargill Licensing Trust, ILT Foundation, Community Trust of Southland, ICC & SDC Creative Communities, Southern Trust & Waxy O'Sheas. Likewise I'd like to acknowledge the continue support of the Christchurch competitors, from the O'Neill School of Irish Dance, whose attendance help make this competition possible, beneficial and viable.

It was wonderful to see all the dancers showcasing their incredible talent and also the camaraderie back-stage and afterwards. The competition was very close in all age categories and all of the competitors performed admirably. We were also fortunate to have some beginners perform on stage for the very first time; always a favourite with the spectators. During the session break, some of the parents were invited up to dance with their daughter; a moment I unfortunately (or fortunately) I had to miss, as collating the results was high on the agenda at that moment in time. The afternoon went by all too quickly and I sincerely hope the spectators who visited had an enjoyable afternoon; an afternoon that was full of bling, toe-tapping dancing, incredible talent, ability, athleticism, grace, rhythm and timing, all of which comprises the art form of Irish Dance. I'd recommend anyone who hasn't been to see Irish dancing at a competitive level take this opportunity to see the future aspiring "Lord of the Dance" & Riverdance dancers. This year the competition will be held on Sunday 27 August at Repertory House and we look forward to seeing you.

2016 saw a full programme of entries and it was very timely that we held the Competitions at the Civic Theatre for Ballet and Modern Dance as there was ample room for all competitors and Officials. We had two Adjudicators – Cameron Fulton and Jason Yang-Westland. Nomination classes were held for the Modern section & the new Troupe/Group class which was reinstated in 2016 We are pleased to say that we will have representatives in each genre at the 2017 NYPA. This year Ballet is one of the four arts for the National Young Performer Awards and we welcome entrants in the nomination class. It looks as though the Troupe/Group section is here to stay and look forward to running this exciting class again. Those nominated in September 2017 will go on to represent the Society at the NYPA 2018.

The ILT Scholarship section was once again well represented with some fantastic dancing performed. I'd like to acknowledge and thank our wonderful group of helpers who added to the smooth running of the competition. This year's competition will once again be held at Centrestage, 19-20 August 2017.
