SPECIAL ACKNOWLEDGEMENT & AWARD

<u>HAZEL MARGARET CHRISTIE - MNZM -</u> AWARDS FOR SOUTHLAND COMPETITORS

Southland Competitions Society Inc. kindly acknowledge and remember past Patron Hazel Christie (MNZM), who sadly passed away 2019. Hazel was an avid supporter of our competitions, being our official pianist from 1963. In 1996 Hazel joined our committee whilst continuing being our accompanist. In 2009, in recognition of her service Hazel became our Patron and continued to support the arts until her health deteriorated.

In remembrance of Hazel, we honour her dedication, love of our competitions (in particular Vocal & Instrumental), ongoing support and recent gift, with the introduction of the "Hazel Christie - Southland Incentive Award". This will be awarded to a Southland competitor in each of the seven art-forms, for further tuition. The award will be at the sole discretion of the art-form Adjudicator and based on the competitor's effort, attitude, and demonstration of passion for their chosen art-form, (as was demonstrated by Hazel) over the duration of the art-form competition.

IN REMEMBRANCE OF HAZEL MARGARET CHRISTIE (MNZM) – A BRIEF BIOGRAPHY (Kindly provided by Hazel's niece)

Hazel Margaret Christie was born in Invercargill 1926, into a musical family and passed away on 23rd March 2019. Hazel from an early age, alongside her sisters Joan, followed later by Janet, learned the piano from Miss Ruth Ritchie. She excelled in Trinity of College London, music exams, passing her LTCL at about 17 years of age.

Hazel was a frequent competitor in the Annual Southland Competition Society festivals successfully competing in both Pianoforte and vocal sections. It is fitting that she later would become patron of the Southland Competition society.

Music was the primary interest in Hazel's life. She began playing the pipe organ at Central Methodist church at age 14 and accompanied both the Church and Choral society choirs for many years. Hazel was a recognized accompanist for local children's exams and festivals, visiting artists, brass bands and many local events.

Hazel was awarded Citizen of year award from the Invercargill Host Lions club in 1990 and the **MNZM** medal (NZ order of Merit member) in the 1998 New Year's Honours list for services to the community.

Southland Competitions Society Inc does not provide an Official Accompanist for the Competitions. Each entrant is free to use an accompanist of their own choice and all arrangements **including rehearsal & performance payments** must be made between the entrant and the accompanist. An Accompanist will not sight-read items. The music must be clear for the accompanist to read and, if it is sheet music that has been put in plastic covers, the covers must be non-reflective.

COPYRIGHT COMPLIANCE

In order to comply with NZ copyright law, Competitors must bring the "original" of their music. For the purposes of this Competition an "Original" includes a copy that was purchased online. Please check if your pieces are old versions that have been re-released, as the newer version may fall under copyright law again.

GENERAL CONDITIONS FOR COMPETITORS

NO REFUND ON ENTRY FEES ONE ENTRY FORM PER COMPETITOR

ANY COMPETITOR ENTERING IN AN INCORRECT CLASS WILL BE DISQUALIFIED. PLEASE CHECK YOUR APPROPRIATE CLASS NUMBER.

Status: These competitions are open only to amateurs. An amateur means "one whose income is not derived mainly from the use of his/her talents in the particular section in which he or she is competing". The Executive reserves the right to determine the status of any competitor.

2 Age Limits:

- (a) "Age limits" means that the birthday of the year must not have been passed on the day the Competitions are fixed to begin, namely 01st October 2022 (Speech & Drama) 30th October 2022 (Ballet & Modern Dance / Instrumental / Vocal).
- (b) Except in the Open Classes, competitors will be allowed to compete in their own age group only.
- Entry Fees: All entry fees must be paid at the time of entry. No entry will be recorded unless the necessary fees have been paid. The Executive reserves the right to refuse any entry.
- 4 **Accidents:** All competitors compete at their own risk, and the Executive accepts no responsibility for accidents or mishaps, and on these conditions only, are entries received.
- Videography: Anyone wishing to digitally record an item must request permission at the office of the venue. Strict conditions apply. The recording will be monitored. Any abuse of this privilege may result in the confiscation of videoing equipment for the duration of the Competition.
- 6 Merging of Classes: The Executive reserves the right to merge classes as required.
- 7 **Novice/Restricted** A novice/restricted class is open only to competitors who have not been placed first at these or any other similar Competitions prior to the commencement of this Festival.
- 8 **Dress Code:** Competitors are expected to present a neat and tidy appearance.
- 9 Selected Items:
 - (a) Competitors must not approach the Adjudicator's table to leave or collect copies.
 - (b) Any Convenor or Adjudicator is authorised to debar or to stop any performance of a sacrilegious or objectionable nature.
 - (c) No item performed in one class may be repeated in another by the same person. The only exceptions to this rule is for entrants in the National Award Nomination Classes, Restricted Achievers Tap Championship & Irish Dancing Beginner/Intermediate Sections, & Ballet & Modern Novice Classes.
- 10 **Own Selection:** Copies must be collected during the session immediately following that in which the competitor appeared.

11 Order of Performance:

- (a) Competitors' names will appear on the programme in the order in which they will be called upon to perform.
- (b) All competitors must report back-stage at least fifteen (15) minutes prior to the commencement of their class.
- (c) The Executive reserves the right for the Competitions to run **up to 30 minutes** ahead of those times scheduled in the programme.
- **Prompting:** No prompting or assistance of any kind shall be given during the performance except by the Adjudicator.

13 Communication with Adjudicators.

- (a) Communication with Adjudicators by competitors, teachers, parents or other interested parties, prior to or during the competitions, is absolutely prohibited. The Executive reserves the right to disqualify a competitor for any breach of this Rule.
- (b) Communication with adjudicator by competitors, teachers, parents, or other interested Parties, prior to, or during the competitions, is absolutely prohibited and may result in the competitor being disqualified.
- 14 **Side Stage and Dressing Rooms:** Parents of competitors will be admitted to the Dressing Rooms only. There is no allocation of dressing rooms. To comply with Health & Safety regulations, personnel side stage will be kept to a minimum.
- 15 **Report Sheets:** Will be available from the venue after the results have been announced.

16 **Protests**:

- (a) Any competitor wishing to protest (this may include the right to challenge the amateur status of any other competitor) must do so in writing, setting out the grounds, and lodging the same with the Secretary, together with \$5.00 as a sign of good faith.
- (b) Should the Executive, after investigation, deem any protest to be frivolous or unfounded, the deposit may be forfeited.
- (c) No protest will be considered unless lodged as specified within 24 hours after the results have been announced.
- (d) No protest can be made against any decision of an Adjudicator.
- 17 **Trophy Winners:** Trophy Winners are responsible for the engraving of their names on cups. In the case of a shared prize, it is the first recipient's responsibility to pass on the trophy in time to ensure each winner holds the prize for an equal amount of time.

CUPS:

- All cups mentioned in the Syllabus are Challenge cups which remain the property of the Society, but are held by the winners and must be returned by the dates specified in (4) below.
- 2 Last year's cup winners please return cups by the due dates.

IMPORTANT - IF CUPS ARE NOT RETURNED BY DUE DATE THEN ENTRIES FROM THOSE HOLDERS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.

- Damage to cups is the responsibility of the competitor. Cups are to be returned in a **CLEAN AND UNDAMAGED** condition. Failure to comply may result in a fine of \$25.00 per trophy.

PRIZES:

Prizes will be awarded as follows:

- First, second and third prizes are awarded, with the following exceptions:
 - (a) In the event of a TIE the following will be enacted:-
 - **Tie for 1st (i.e.:- 2 achieving 100)** The monies designated for first and second places will be combined and then divided equally. The monies designated for third place will then be awarded to the next highest competitor (i.e: competitor gaining 99) NO MONIES WILL BE AWARDED FOR A COMPETITOR WITH 98.
 - **Tie for 2nd (i.e.: 2 achieving 99)** The monies for second and third places will be combined and then divided equally. NO MONIES WILL BE AWARDED FOR THE COMPETITOR WITH 98).
 - **Tie for 3rd (ie: 2 achieving 98)** The monies designated for third place will be divided equally. This rule applies for all Art Forms, unless specifically designated otherwise by an outside
 - (b) sponsor.
 - Where there are three (3) or fewer entries in a class, the awarding of any prize is at the discretion of the Adjudicator.
 - (c) The Adjudicator may withhold, at his/her discretion, the first or any prize if the standard is not sufficiently high.
 - (d) All Classes, all Ages, all Arts, Ribbons will be issued for placings from 1st to Commended where applicable.
- 2 All Prize Money will be awarded to winners at the award ceremonies on the day. All Competitors must sign for monetary prizes.

Competitors - <u>Must be of the same family in the same</u> <u>Art Form</u>. Competitor entry forms must only pay for the individual entry fee NOT a collective entry fee for the family competitors.

Family Door Passes: - \$20.00 per family per Competition (i.e. Separate fee payable for August Competition & October Competition) for -

Tap Dancing (August Competitions), one fee payable per entrant/family – fees payable from August competitions do not cover October Competitions.

- TO ENSURE NO DANCER THAT ENTERS BY THE CLOSING DATE MISSES OUT ON COMPETING all dancers are requested to list in order, their preferred nine classes they wish to enter (not including duo/trio & groups & the top nine must include any dances needed for Championship classes). Further dances should then be ordered and the Convenor will add these if time allows. Full payment must be paid for all classes listed on entry and any refunds due to classes being full will be refunded after the Competition. Please ensure the entry form states the bank account to refund any monies to. ** Applicable only to those competitors entering more than nine classes**

3 Selected Items:

- (a) **Barefoot:** No footwear what so ever to be worn in barefoot classes.
- (b) **Choreography:** All classes including championships are to be original choreography The only exception is for Variations.
- (c) **Young Performer:** Entrants to Young Performer of the Year Award class must compete in two other classes other than Championships.
- (d) Titles of Demi Character, Barefoot & Variation Dances, must be adhered to, as stated on the entry form or advised to the Secretary
- (e) No item performed in one class may be repeated in another by the same person. The only exceptions to this rule are for entrants in the National Award Nomination Classes, Ballet and Modern Jazz Championships and Novice Classes.

NATIONAL YOUNG PERFORMER AWARDS 2023 CRITERIA FOR MODERN DANCE

- A. Competitors shall be 15 and under 21 years as at 1 October 2023.
- B. Each competitor shall perform in three classes during the preliminary round:
 - 1. Modern/Jazz
 - 2. Contemporary
 - 3. Master Class run by the Adjudicators. No audience observation.
- C. There shall be a maximum time limit of 3 1/2 minutes for each dance, taken from the beginning to the conclusion of the music.
- D. There will be a semi-final at which competitors will repeat either B. 1 or B. 2 at the discretion of the adjudicators. Competitors will be chosen based on their marks in the Preliminary round(s).

- E. For the Final Award Concert six competitors will be recalled and shall repeat the item not performed at the semi-final.
- F. Costumes, choreography & music should be appropriate to the age of the competitors and suitable for a family audience this will be at the Adjudicators discretion.

NB. Nomination of competitors by Societies should be based on classes B1 and B2 i.e. with or without the Master Class, but may include an impromptu class, at the discretion of the society.

NB: FOR THE NATIONAL COMPETITION

Nominees do NOT need to perform the same dances they used to win a Nomination. Nominees in the Modern Dance section are required to upload performance copies of their music when submitting their entry form, and a list of the titles and composer and/or artists for each piece. They must bring the same music on USB to registration. No changes are permitted after the 8th Sept 2023.

SOCIETY NOMINATION

Each Society, which is a financial member of PACANZ, may nominate up to two competitors, who shall be selected by the adjudicator, based on Criteria stated in A, B and C.

The adjudicator will determine that a competitor has displayed a sufficient standard of performance to competently represent that society at the National Young Performer Awards.

The standard required will be at the absolute discretion of the adjudicator but will include:

- A demonstration of adequate preparation
- An authority of performance
- A performance with a level of maturity commensurate with a national final competition of this age group.

If the adjudicator considers that sufficient standard has NOT been reached by any competitor, then NO nomination will be made.

The Nominating Society is responsible for paying part of the entry fee to the National Young Performer Awards, which is \$75.00 incl GST.

The Nominee is responsible for paying their portion of the entry fee to the National Young Performer Awards, which is \$175.00 incl GST.



NATIONAL YOUNG PERFORMER AWARDS 2023 CRITERIA FOR TROUPES

- A. Competitors will be under 25 years as at 1st of October 2023. Competitors may only compete in **TWO** nominated Troupe/Group PER Studio OR Educational Institution.
- B. Each Troupe will be nominated at a Member Society Competition by performing in any dance genre pertinent to the Competition they enter. This competition is for amateur troupes only and is not open to professionals*.
- C. There will be a maximum time limit of 4 1/2 minutes, taken from the beginning to the conclusion of the music.
- D. Troupes who gain nomination **must** be able to attend the National Young Performer Competition which will be held in Palmerston North. Compulsory Registration/Orientation will be on Thursday 19th October and the Competition will be on Friday 20th October 2023.
- E. A Final will be held on the afternoon/evening of Friday 20th October, with up to **18 Troupes** recalled to perform. The number of Troupes in the Final may change, at the discretion of the Adjudicator(s)
- F. It MAY be possible for the top 3 Troupes to perform at the Soloist Final Award Concert on the evening of Sunday 22nd October 2023.
- G. Costumes, choreography & music should be appropriate to the age of both the competitors and suitable for a family audience.

ADDITIONAL RULES

- A. Once a Troupe Item has received a Nomination, it is no longer eligible to enter another Nomination class. The Studio name and the genre of the nominated item will be published on the PACANZ website as soon as PACANZ is notified by the nominating Society.
- B. The Item receiving a Nomination will be **substantially** the same Item when it is performed at the National Young Performer Awards on 20th October 2023. The genre and theme will be the same with minor alterations allowed in music, choreography, dancer number and costuming.
- C. Troupe nominations are subject to challenge and a Troupe risks disqualifying themselves, if the above criteria are not adhered to.
- NB. The CLOSING DATES will be relative to the date of Nomination. Troupe members' names and ages & entry fee will need to be submitted on the Official Entry by the closing date.

 Nominees in the Troupe section are required to upload performance copies of their music in MP3 format when submitting their entry, and a list of the titles and composer and/or artists for each piece. They must bring the same music on USB to registration. The FINAL DATE for submitting music is 6th September 2023.

SOCIETY NOMINATION

Each Society, which is a financial member of PACANZ, may nominate **ONE Troupe****, who shall be selected by the adjudicator, based on a performance at the Member Society Competition.

The adjudicator will determine that the Troupe has displayed a sufficient standard of performance to competently represent that society at the National Troupe Finals.

The standard required will be at the absolute discretion of the adjudicator but will include:

- A demonstration of adequate preparation
- An authority of performance
- A performance with a level of expertise commensurate with a national final competition.

If the adjudicator considers that sufficient standard has **NOT** been reached by any Troupe, then **NO** nomination will be made.

The nominated Troupe is responsible for paying the entry fee to the National Young Performer Awards, which is **\$250.00** incl GST.

- * A professional is someone whose primary employment is being paid to perform or work in the performing arts. For the present purposes, being a student constitutes "primary employment" and therefore is not seen as a Professional. For the Student who receives payment for participation, either teaching or performing, this should not impose professional status on a person if it is by way only of an occasional bonus or benefit rather than their principal means of earning a livelihood. The exception to this is a participating teacher who may perform.
- ** As some Societies split their dance genres and run large Competitions with different Judges and/or at different times of the year, they will be able to nominate more than one Troupe to represent their Society.
- ** If a Society has 25 or more Troupes that enter and compete for a Troupe Nomination, then they are entitled to offer an additional Nomination. This applies to every multiple of 20 Troupes that enter and compete for a Troupe Nomination. Therefore –

1-19 Troupes = 1 Nomination

20 Troupes = 1 additional Nomination

40 Troupes = 2 additional Nominations

60 Troupes = 3 additional Nominations

NATIONAL YOUNG PERFORMER AWARDS 2023 CRITERIA FOR ACOUSTIC INSTRUMENTS

- A. Competitors shall be 15 and under 21 years of age as at 1st October 2023.
- B. This award is open to competitors on any (non-electric) acoustic instrument. Not including Piano, which is another genre at the NYPA.
- C. The programme should consist of three contrasting pieces from different periods of musical history, i.e. Baroque, Classical, Romantic, 20th Century or Contemporary.

1. Selected Items:

- (a) Titles of Songs in Character in Vocal Sections must be adhered to, as stated on the entry form or advised to the Secretary no later than 20 July 2022. For Senior Vocal all titles for Own Selection should be listed.
- (b) Music for each class is to be handed to the steward on duty before the commencement of the particular class, and shall bear at the head of the front page the competitor's name and number, plus the class number. These should be provided on a session by session basis, not in bulk. (REFER COPYRIGHT).
 - i <u>musicnotes.com</u> has a wide variety of songs/sheet music for competitors looking for original copies.
- (c) Any Competitor in this section who has won at a previous Festival conducted by this Society, may only use the same item again after a lapse of five (5) years. The only exception to this rule is for entrants in the National Award Nomination Class
- 2. Accompanist and Backing Competitors must provide their own accompanist or backing track. (If you require an accompanist, please contact the Convenor for a list of available accompanists and information about accompanist rates.)

While the use of an accompanist is preferred in the first instance, backing tracks will be accepted. Backing tracks must be single instrument with no backing vocals or harmonies.

(If the competitor requires assistance with removal of instruments from backing tracks, please contact the same email address).

Competitors are to send backing tracks via email to the Convenor by **2 September 2022**. Please include the class name and competitor in the email subject line, and rename the mp3 file with the same information (class name and competitor). Please send **one backing track per email** to **southlandvocalcomp@gmail.com**.

The competitor must bring a copy of the backing track on a device to the venue on the day of their performance as a back-up option

- **3.** Rehearsals Competitors wishing to use an accompanist must make their own rehearsal arrangements at least four weeks prior to their competitions date.
